## Why prairie dogs?

In 1804 Meriwether Lewis, William Clark and their Corps of Discovery set out to explore the vast and unknown spaces of the Louisiana Purchase in search of a waterway to the west. During their 2 1/2-year historic journey, the explorers encountered hundreds of animals never before known to science. None of these animals fascinated them more than the prairie dog, which inhabited countless "villages" in grasslands of the Midwest.

The Corps of Discovery spent Sept. 7, 1804, trying to coax one of the quick little "barking squirrels" from its hole in hopes of sending the live animal to **President Thomas** Jefferson. At last they succeeded and the prairie dog was shipped to the White House for President Jefferson's personal study. He later sent the prairie dog to the natural science museum in Independence Hall in Philadelphia.


The Prairie Dog Quest is in honor of that "discov-


ery." Sponsored by the Sioux City Art Center, it's designed to bring art into public spaces.


